The scope of practice for medication assistants in the state of Alabama is regulated by the Alabama Board of Nursing (ABN).

To be eligible for the class, a high school diploma, or GED, drug screen and background check is required. Certified Nursing Assistant, or clinical experience, is helpful but not required.

Medication Assistant

The medication assistant program is a 100 hour training course that prepares students to administer routine medications to patients in a variety of healthcare settings. Medication Assistants practice under the supervision of licensed nurses. Upon successful completion students will be eligible to apply for the Medication Assistant Certification Exam (MACE).
